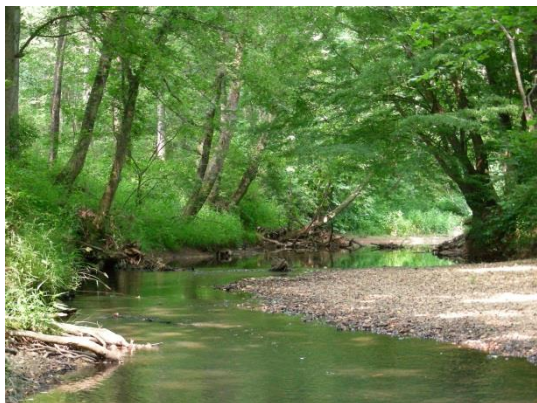


About Friends of Price Park

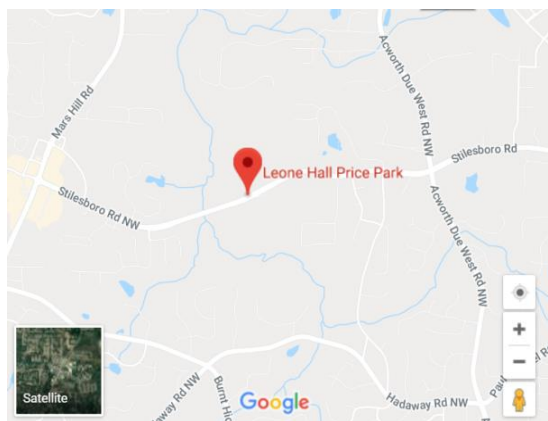

TAKE A HIKE!

Leone Hall Price Park spans 243 acres on both sides of Allatoona Creek and on both sides of Stilesboro Road. Price Park is a passive park with natural trails, meadows, beautiful Allatoona Creek running through it, and an array of native plant and animal species. It is a great place to bird watch, hike, take the kids or dog for a walk, get your feet wet in the creek and enjoy the quiet respite that nature provides.

The Park is named after Leone Hall Price, who lived on the north side of Stilesboro Road. Mrs. Price passed away in 2001. She donated 108 acres to Cobb County on the south side of Stilesboro Road to become parkland. She stipulated the land become a passive park and remain in a natural state and to be a place people can enjoy for generations to come. She wished to promote education, historical restoration and environmental preservation in Cobb and the surrounding counties.

In 2007, 17.7 acres were purchased by Cobb County adjacent to the original property. The Friends of Price Park organization worked with Cobb County and many volunteers, businesses, Scouts, etc, to create and maintain the trails and amenities on the property.

In 2018, Cobb County purchased 117 additional acres of property on the north side of Stilesboro Road. This expanded Leone Hall Price Park to 243 total acres. A covered pavilion with picnic tables, water fountains and restrooms and additional parking were also added in 2018.
